STUDENT CLUBS

The Annual Fund provided increased support for student clubs, including:

- Professional copyeditor for Lit Mag
- Conference registration fees for Science Team

BUA's award-winning Robotics Team 246 Overclocked hosted 32 teams from around Massachusetts for its annual VEX tournament in Sargent Gym.

250 middle school students from across the state convened at BU's College of Arts and Sciences for the 5th installment of BUAMUN, BUA's two-day, student-run Model United Nations conference. Over two dozen BUA chairs and co-chairs led the delegates in discussions on topics including — but not limited to — infectious disease, the U.S. space race, and ISIS.

A generous anonymous gift enabled BUA faculty and staff to be trained in CPR, AED, and First Aid.



FINANCIAL AID

- > 35% of our students received need-based financial aid.
- The average award was \$26,326.
- The range of financial aid awards was \$3,918-\$41,868.

BUA provided over \$10,000 in financial aid to enable 6 students to participate in the spring international trip to Rome.

As part of our commitment to making the full BUA experience available to all students, the school provided financial assistance for tickets to Prom, the Semi-Formal dance, and to Performing Arts Outing Club excursions.

BUA launched a new PE program, which enabled

In 2016-17, BUA saw a rise in student participation across many athletic offerings. Increased demand necessitated additional facility rentals, assistant coaches, referees, and transportation — costs covered in part by the Annual Fund:

- 20% increase in student participation in soccer
- ▶ 25% in crew
- 30% in tennis
- 40% in basketball

ALUMNI

- 202 alumni (over 30%!) attended events in 9 cities across the country.
- **BUA** alumni achieved the Alumni Giving Challenge — Kenny Bacow '00 and Alex Maloney '02 offered to match all new and increased gifts to the Annual Fund up to \$7,500.
